

Openings on Township Boards, Commissions, Committees

The Township has several openings for volunteers willing to serve on Township Boards, Commissions and Committees.

Environmental Advisory Council

The Township is looking for Township residents to fill three (3) vacancies on the Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC).

The EAC is a 12-person advisory board, 7 of who are voting members and 5 who are associate or non-voting members. The EAC meets monthly to discuss a variety of environmental issues facing the township and provide advice and recommendations to the Township Council. Regular duties include plan review, public education, research, promotion of programs such as preservation of natural areas and water quality, and planning for a viable approach to natural resource protection.

Parks & Recreation Board

The Township is looking for a Township resident to fill one (1) vacancy on the Parks & Recreation Board.

The Parks & Recreation Board is a 7-member advisory board that is responsible for making recommendations to the Township Council concerning recreational programs and facilities and for park area acquisition and development.

Parks & Recreation Board members serve for one (1) year terms.

Landfill Committee

The Township is looking for Township residents to fill the two (2) resident vacancies on the Landfill Committee.

The Landfill Committee is comprised of representatives from the IESI Bethlehem Landfill, two (2) residents from the Township, the Township Host Municipal Inspector (HMI), special technical consultants as needed, the Township Engineer and a Council Liaison. The Landfill Committee holds monthly meetings at the Landfill and is responsible for periodically monitoring Landfill operations and for reviewing and reporting on Landfill related complaints.

Landfill Committee representatives serve for a two (2) year term.

Yard Waste Recycling Committee

The Township is looking for a Township resident to fill one (1) vacancy on the Yard Waste Recycling Committee.

The Yard Waste Recycling Committee is comprised of one (1) elected representative from the Borough of Hellertown and Lower Saucon Township; the Borough and Township Managers; the Director or Supervisor of Public Works from each municipality, and one (1) citizen resident of each municipality and is responsible for developing policies and procedures regulating the day to day operation of the Saucon Valley Compost Center.

Yard Waste Recycling Committee members serve for one (1) year terms.
