Dear Ms. Binckley and Mr. Cox:

I acknowledge receipt of Ms. Binckley's letter dated November 9, 2016 regarding stormwater management for the PennEast Pipeline project, which describes in very general terms the proposed project stormwater management measures, erosion and sediment control plans, and PADEP/Conservation District permitting.

As the letter indicates, PennEast plans to construct not only its proposed natural gas pipeline, but also aboveground facilities described as the Hellertown Launcher and Mainline Launcher/Receiver and TCO and UGI/LEH Interconnects within Lower Saucon Township.


Kindly note that in 2007 the Township enacted the "Lower Saucon Township Earth Disturbance Ordinance," and the "Lower Saucon Township Stormwater Management Ordinance," (Chapters 77 and 137 respectively, of the Township Code). The Ordinances are publicly available online at: <http://ecode360.com/10517882> and <http://ecode360.com/10518117>. These Ordinances establish requirements for regulated activities (including construction of new impervious surfaces and regulated earth disturbance activities) as defined in the Ordinances. These requirements include, but are not limited to, Township review and approval of certain earth disturbance activities, drainage plans, and compliance with requirements for best management practices.

Please advise at your earliest opportunity of the anticipated schedule for PennEast to submit to the Township the materials required by the Ordinances so that the Township can be guided accordingly. (If PennEast believes that it is exempt from any requirement of the Ordinances, kindly advise of the basis for such a belief.) We note that PennEast has submitted applications for local permits for aboveground facilities in other Townships including, but not limited to, Hopewell Township (NJ),

and Kidder Township (PA). It is the Township's intention to review PennEast's application materials in the normal course and to make permitting decisions in a reasonably expeditious manner.

Thank you for your anticipated cooperation. I look forward to PennEast's response.
