
Project Update for Landowners on the Pipeline Route

With beneficial input from landowners and agencies, the PennEast Pipeline Project continues to proceed as planned. This includes providing information to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) – such as PennEast’s February 22 response to a recent FERC Data Request – to assist FERC as it prepares its Draft Environmental Impact Statement.

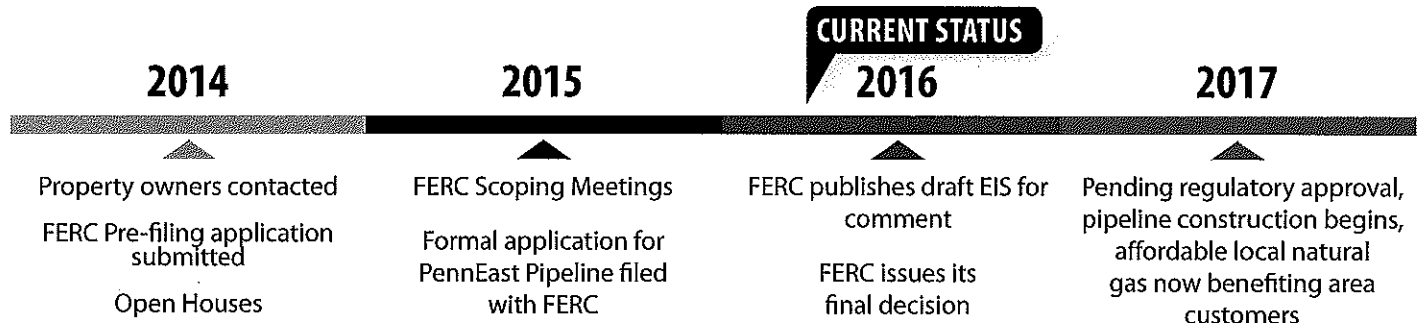
PennEast has also applied to the Delaware River Basin Commission to, among other things, conduct horizontal directional drilling (HDD) and hydrostatic testing activities. HDD will allow PennEast to minimize impact during construction, and hydrostatic testing is a key safety protocol following construction. Hydrostatic testing is where PennEast will temporarily fill the Pipeline with water (at pressures greater than it will ever operate when natural gas is flowing) to test the structural integrity of the Pipeline prior to placing it into service.

Additionally, PennEast is excited to announce that Berg Steel Pipe Corporation will be providing the steel that will comprise the Pipeline. The Company has a more than 35-year history manufacturing the highest quality carbon steel pipe. Its mills and employees (representing jobs beyond PennEast’s construction economic impact analysis) in Panama City, Florida, and Mobile, Alabama, will be supplying PennEast’s pipe sections.

PennEast also has purchased the three turbines that will power the Kidder Compressor Station. These low-emission turbines are produced by San Diego-based Solar Turbines, a subsidiary of Caterpillar Inc. Solar Turbines has been in the industrial gas turbine business for more than 55 years, and has units operating in more than 100 countries.

WORKING TOGETHER

PennEast acknowledges that an easement agreement is a very long-term relationship. That's why PennEast wants to do everything in its power to start things on the right foot.

Resulting from extensive analysis, PennEast believes its offers to landowners reflect a premium including, among other things, avoiding the cost of a third-party determination and PennEast's commitment to negotiate early agreements.

If landowners and PennEast are unable to negotiate an easement now, a future third-party determination will be based solely on market value, which likely will be lower than the current offer which includes a host of considerations. To the benefit of the landowners and the Project overall, PennEast would like to direct any potential cost savings anticipated with the third-party determination process to landowners as part of a fair easement agreement.

NEW REPORT

Property values unaffected by presence of pipelines

A new report conducted by Integra Realty Resources (IRR), a leading provider of real estate valuation and counseling services, affirms previous study findings that **the presence of an underground natural gas transmission pipeline does not affect the sale prices or value of residential properties.**

IRR compared approximately 200 transactions in five areas. In addition to not affecting property value, analysts found that pipelines do not affect a property's insurability, its desirability or the ability to obtain a mortgage.

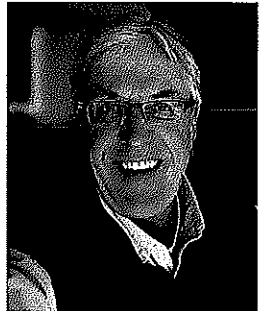
