



BODY CAMERA DEPLOYMENT

On Saturday January 30, 2021, Lower Saucon Township Police Officers began wearing Body Worn Cameras while on duty. Lower Saucon Township Police Department patrol vehicles have been equipped with in-car camera systems for over a decade.





All this was made possible by a \$22,000.00 grant from the Federal Bureau of Justice, in partnership with the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association and the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency. The total cost of the body-camera project was \$44,007.00.

New Look - Lower Saucon Township Police Officers Unveil New Uniforms



Lower Saucon Township Police Officers have a new look as of Monday, April 5th. The new uniforms consist of a dark navy shirt and pants with maroon stripe on the pants. The existing shoulder patch has been outlined with the same maroon compliment the entire uniform.

The change came about after the previous gray uniform worn by the department, for as long as can be remembered by both current and retired officers, was discontinued by the manufacturer. When this occurred, Township Manager Leslie Huhn and Chief of Police Thomas Barndt made the decision it was time for a change. The uniform design was presented to Township Council who approved the budgeted purchase.

The new, lighter weight uniforms were well received by the Officers who are proudly wearing them as they serve the community.

Compost Center News

The SAUCON VALLEY COMPOST CENTER, located at 2011 Springtown Hill Road, Lower Saucon Township, is officially open for the 2021 season.

The Center will be open from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. every Friday and Saturday until Saturday, November 20th.

The Center is closed Sunday through Thursday during the season.



For your safety and others, please be reminded that loads must be secured when you transport to/from the Saucon Valley Compost Center.

The PA Vehicle Code Section 4903 "Securing Loads In Vehicles" states that "No vehicle shall be driven or moved on any highway unless the vehicle is so constructed or loaded as to prevent any of its load from dropping, sifting, leaking or otherwise escaping".

- 1. The vehicle must have four solid sides with a cover or top to prevent any of the load from escaping.
- The cover or top shall remain tightly in place while going to the disposal site.
- 3. The load shall be no higher than the solid sides of the vehicle
- 4. The penalty for a violation of this shall be no less than \$300.00 and no more than \$1,000.00.

Lower Saucon Township Real Estate Tax Information

As a property owner in Lower Saucon Township, you will receive three (3) real estate tax bills per year. They are:

Lower Saucon Township Real Estate Taxes –
5.14 mills (.00514) - (4.39 General & .75 Fire Appropriation)
Northampton County Real Estate Taxes –
11.8 mills (.0118)

Saucon Valley School District Real Estate Taxes – 53.43 mills (.05343)

Lower Saucon Township Tax bills were sent out in early February. If a mortgage company pays your taxes, it is the *property owner's responsibility* to send the tax bill to your mortgage company.

Billing Date: February 1, 2021
Discount – 2% Due: April 5, 2021
Base Due: June 7, 2021
Penalty – 10% After: June 7, 2021

Please note due dates if you are opting to pay by installments.

Due to COVID-19, Fulton Bank is not able to provide receipts. If you would like a receipt please provide a self addressed, stamped envelope with your payment and drop it in our drop box 24/7. We will be happy to prepare your receipt and mail it back to you.

2021 Sweeper Schedule

Please be advised that the our Public Works Department began the annual spring cleanup of streets from winter snow removal operations in April. The sweeping process usually takes about 2 months to complete.

The sweeping order is based on areas within the Township and are rotated annually to insure equality for all of the residents of the Township:

- 1. Bingen (South of Friedensville Road/Black River Road and West of Leithsville Road Rte. 412)
- Seidersville Area (West of Mountain Drive and North of Black River Road)
- 3. Steel City Area (North of Easton Road to Steel City)
- 4. Apple Street Area (North of Wassergass Road to Easton Road)
- 5. Wassergass Area (North of Polk Valley Road to Wassergass Road)
- 6. Leithsville Area (East of Leithsville Road Rte. 412 and South of Polk Valley Road)

Spring Ahead with Zoning/Building as May is Deck Safety Month

As we approach spring many families are spending more time together, and will be looking to get outdoors and make use of their space.

With more than 60 million decks in the U.S., it is estimated that 30 million decks are past their useful life and need to be replaced or repaired. It is crucial for homeowners to have their decks inspected to verify the integrity of their deck to ensure user safety as well as help extend the deck's life-span, improve appearance, and increase livability.

Visit NADRA.org to take advantage of resources to Check Your Deck®. Homeowners can download the 10-Point Deck Safety Consumer Checklist, a step-by-step guide to visually inspecting the deck for safety concerns such as corroding fasteners, decaying materials, loose railings, inadequate lighting, and more. Though not a replacement for a professional deck inspection, the checklist is a helpful tool to assist homeowners.



For your safety, the Zoning Department would like to remind Residents that all construction, additions, placement of prebuilt structures (sheds, hot tubs, swimming pools, etc.), paving, patios, fences, and decks require that a permit be obtained **before** any work can be started. This includes inflatable swimming pools deeper than 24".

Pennsylvania State law requires the Township to adhere to the Uniform Construction Code (UCC), better known as the "Building Code". The UCC allows a municipality up to 15 working days to review a permit application for residential properties and either grant or reject the permit from the time a completed application is submitted to the municipality.

A completed application includes an application form, a site plan for the entire lot showing all existing and proposed improvements on the lot (including driveways, buildings, patios, decks, and sidewalks) with all dimensions and distances to property lines and the amount of impervious coverage; proof of workers compensation certificate or waiver, a copy of all the approved documentation related to the proposed improvements from one of our 3rd party inspection agencies; and, any other permits that may be required for the proposed construction (i.e. grading permits, carbonate geology review, etc.). Lower Saucon Township strives to process the permits as quickly as possible.

No work can be started until you have an approved permit in hand and a placard placed in a location that can be seen from the street.

New! Trap Neuter Return Program for Feral Cats

What is Trap Neuter Return (TNR)?

Lower Saucon Township has implemented a TNR program to help control breeding of free roaming populations feral cat



within the Township. We have partnered with No Nonsense Neutering (NNN) in Allentown, who will neuter the cats, vaccinate them for rabies and return them to the resident. Cats are not dumped back into the wild and residents are responsible to work with NNN to bring them in. The Township will assume the cost of neutering once a resident has obtained a voucher that is taken along with the cat to NNN.

TNR is a long-term cat management program, cats are fixed, vaccinated and their left ear is tipped to identify that they have been fixed. Loaner traps are available at all NNN clinics. Check out the Community Cats page on their website for more information at www.nnnlv.org

To obtain a feral cat spay/neuter voucher from the Lower Saucon Township:

- 1. Residents must apply at Lower Saucon Township for a NNN Feral Cat spay/neuter voucher (5-voucher limit at a time) and a driver's license is required. The voucher includes one Feral cat spay/neuter surgery, rabies & distemper vaccine, nail trim, ear cleaning, fluids, pain medicine, flea, ear mite and worming treatment. Left ear will be tipped as it is a requirement for outside roaming cats.
- 2. Residents must set-up appointment(s) by calling 866-820-2510 ext. # 2 (in Allentown) or schedule online at www.nnnlv.orhg/spay-neuter/schedule-anappointment/
- 3. Vouchers are not transferrable and can only be used the person in whose name bv issued. ID will be required at NNN at check-in.
- 4. Residents must contact Lower Saucon Township (610-865-3291) with appointment date of spaying/ neutering.
- 5. Unused vouchers must be returned to Lower Saucon Township before the expiration date listed on the voucher.



As we celebrate the retirement of K-9 Atos, we are officially welcoming our newest Police K-9, "TITUS" to the department. Thanks to an anonymous Township donor who we are very grateful for, K-9 Titus will be the fourth canine to join the department since the inception of the canine program in 2000.

Titus is a 2 year-old Belgian Malinois and was imported from Holland, where he received his initial training. Titus then attended the Progressive K-9 Academy along with his handler, Officer Steve Kunigus. At the completion of the K-9 Academy Titus received his certifications through the National Police Canine Association.

Titus has already been on several successful deployments in his short time here and we are excited for his future within the department and wish him a safe, successful career.
