#### Comments:

The PA Department of Environmental Protection ("Department") conducted a routine complete inspection on August 11, 2021 at Bethlehem Landfill Company ("BLC"). Representing the Department was Amy Faulch ("this inspector"). Mr. Astor Lawson, provided a site tour and was interviewed on behalf of BLC. See the 8/11/21 odor patrol log for weather details.

#### SITE TOUR:

Prior to entering the landfill, this inspector conducted an odor patrol in the areas surrounding the landfill. A strong, persistent sewage odor was detected along Shimersville Rd. near the sewage treatment plant. A light, intermittent wood burning odor was detected along Mixsell Rd. at 0941 hours. No other offsite odors were detected during this odor patrol. See the 8/11/21 odor patrol log for details.

This inspector entered the landfill at 10:32 hours. During the last inspection, BLC was operating a dual working face in both the northern section of SE-2A/B and in the southern section of SE-2A/B. Due to an increase in detection zone flow to the SE-2AB sump, BLC had temporarily ceased accepting waste in the southern portion of SE-2A/B, but have since resumed accepting waste in this area. There was one truck dumping in the southern section of SE-2A/B at the time of this inspection. A moderate garbage odor was detected to the north of the working face. Odor line misters were in operation at the west end of the landfill, and BLC is in the process of installing odor line misters at the east end of the landfill as well.

BLC is continuing a capping project in the western area of the landfill; the south side of this temporary cap area is complete, and BLC is grading slopes to begin the north side. Some gas odor was observed in this Northwest top slope area. BLC is continuing to recover and grade the north slopes. BLC is also continuing the cleanout of Basin #4. The residential drop-off containers have been moved to the west side of the landfill.

Some dust and mud tracking was observed on the landfill's entrance roadsalong Applebutter road, running west from the entrance. BLC's truckwash was down for a cleanout, and the heavy rains on the previous night has caused muddy conditions on site. The street sweeper had already been contacted to sweep Applebutter Rd., as per Mr. Lawson.

BLC's flare was in operation, with a temperature of 1687°F and a flow of 3660 cfm.

#### ODOR COMPLAINT INVESTIGATIONS:

The Department received five odor complaints since the last inspection on 6/9/21. Complaints were followed up with odor patrols conducted by the Department on 7/1/21, 8/5/21 and 8/11/21. See attached odor patrol logs. BLC's odor patrol logs and gas data were reviewed as part of this inspection.

Line item #13: Overweight truck logs revealed the following number of overweight trucks since the last inspection:

June: 57 July: 60

Line items #17, 20-23: BLC's odor patrol logs, gas data and site inspection logs were reviewed. BLC's odor patrols and odor control measures appear to be following their Nuisance Minimization and Control Plan.

Line item #24: Daily tonnages were reviewed for June 2020 to date. There did not appear to be any

exceedances of the 1800 ton daily limit. The greatest one-day tonnages are as follows:

6/14/21: 1795 tons 7/19/21: 1745 tons 8/9/21: 1778 tons

Line item #26-31: Daily radiation monitor checks were reviewed since the last inspection. Records appeared complete. BLC has had the following radiation hits since the 4/28/21 inspection:


