Tethering Dogs in the Bitter Cold is Against the Law

Pet owners are reminded that it's now against the law in Pennsylvania to leave a dog outdoors during harsh winter weather like we've been experiencing lately.

According to <u>Act 10 of 2017</u>, also known as Libre's Law, dogs cannot be tethered outside longer than 30 minutes in temperatures below 32 degrees. However, a dog can still be kept outside, untethered, if their shelter adequately maintains body temperature and keeps the animal dry.
