



Snow covered roads resulting in slippery conditions. Reduced visibilities. Moderate accumulations expected.

Eastern PA and Northern NJ (mainly north and west of I-78 and I-287)

Snow begins early Wednesday morning and continues into the afternoon. The heaviest snow may occur on Wednesday morning.

Freezing Rain



Ice on roads resulting in slippery conditions. Slight buildup of ice on trees and power lines.

Eastern PA and Northern New Jersey (mainly north and west of I-78

and I-287)

Snow changes to sleet and freezing rain, then to all freezing rain late on Wednesday afternoon.

Snow



Snow covered roads resulting in slippery conditions. Reduced visibilities. Light accumulations expected.

Southeast PA, central and southern NJ, and northern portions of the **Delmarva**

Light snow and sleet are expected early on Wednesday morning.

Freezing Rain



Ice on roads resulting in slippery conditions.

Southeast PA, central and southern NJ, and northern portions of the **Delmarva**

Snow and sleet changes to freezing rain on Wednesday morning, then to all rain by Wednesday afternoon.













Expected Snowfall Accumulation

✓ Confidence is ... Moderate













Expected Ice Accumulation

✓ Confidence is ... Moderate












Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast



Event Summary

- ✓ A long duration snowfall for the Poconos and far northern NJ.
- ✓ The heaviest snow is expected to start early Wednesday morning and continue
 into the afternoon in the watch area. The timing could cause travel delays for
 both the Wednesday morning and Wednesday evening commute.
- ✓ Snow changes to sleet and freezing rain late Wednesday afternoon in the Poconos and far northern NJ.
- ✓ For central and southern NJ, southeast PA, and northern portions of the Delmarva: Snow changes quickly to sleet and freezing rain on Wednesday morning, then to all rain by midday Wednesday.
- ✓ Temperatures are forecast to rise above freezing Wednesday afternoon, especially south and east of I-78 and I-287.
